There have been a couple of problems I've had with each of these methods. The first is that I am a designer graph, not a painter or an illustrator. I do more, if not all of my work of art on your computer with Photoshop. I understand that an artist of any kind should be well rounded, and I took my right share of traditional art lessons to college, but this didn't mean I had any illustrated job I wanted to put in a portfolio. For this reason, the leather case looked silly as it would have been only from papers printed by a computer. The second option: A website, while a great avenue for any artist who tries to enter the field, does not fascinate me. Project as a hobby, and the idea of paying for maintenance of a website that I could rarely, or never, the use seemed silly. So when I observed work publications I started asking me what I could do to make a portfolio that would be something that I could use as a resource for my future career. After some thought, I decided that I would like to show their work of art in a convenient digital form. Step 1: Complete your work The first thing you want to do is collect every splinter of works of art you created you want to represent. This could be anything from a sketch in a notebook to a movie poster you designed on your computer. Choose the things you are most proud or what you think it turned out to be as an impressive final product. Helps to make a list of these so you can keep track of which you have and has not yet been added to the portfolio. You can also make a folder on your computer dedicated to the works that will eventually enter your portfolio. An help folder even if you scan drawings / paintings on your computer. This is Adobe InDesign and I'm showing two examples of how you could layout your page. 2: Choose your type of portfolio for my portfolio I chose the PDF format. For this reason, it may be necessary to make changes to the original image depending on whether or not the color changes are harmful to your work. Once Adobe Acrobat is installed on your computer, you can convert a number of different documents into the PDF format, including Microsoft Word, Adobe InDesign (which is what I used), or QuarkXPress. If you don't have any page drawing software, and you can't afford to buy them they are quite expensive if you're a college student), then another option available for you would be the zip folder. In this scenario, all images would be saved in an image format (JPEG would be better) and then zip in a common folder that would be served as your portfolio. (If you made a folder for all the images then you'd be king already in front of the game.) Organize the images and give them a table of content. The last thing you want to do is confuse the Employer: step 3: organize your work you have all the work compiled, it's a good idea to organize in a sense that makes sense to you. If you have a lot of work, you might want to create a table of content to identify projects that are relevant to their specific company. Finally, make a cover page that includes your name, contact information, and a photo you have shaded eyes. This does not mean that you can't include these things, it only means that you should classify it as a design so that the employer can find what was looking for much more easily. If you are using Microsoft Word, Adobe InDesign or QuarkXPress, a summary is quite easy. Include each category of art (logos, illustrations, posters, etc.) and the page number of where everyone starts. If you are using the Zip folder method, try to include a text file with your images that identify them. There are no page numbers, from which you can list each job included, as well as a brief description, so the employer will know if they want to watch it or not. It might also be useful to label your files as follows: logo1, logo2, illustration1, illustration2. This to guarantee the least amount of confusion when viewing the portfolio. If you have had a work or a pre-gathered work that is not related to the work of art in the portfolio, then take a point to write even those at the bottom. Remember only to bring your flash drive. If you think your portfolio is devoid of content, don't be afraid to create something new. Draw a new image or design a mock-up poster.
