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How to convert pdf file to excel format

There are many ways to convert an Excel file to the PDF format. One reason to do this type of conversion is so that the Excel file is more comfortable to open and read on other computers, phones, and tablets, all without having to have a spreadsheet program or app installed. Excel files that remain in the XLSX or XLS format are 100% editable with Excel or another similar spreadsheet program (e.g., OpenOffice Calc and LibreOffice Calc), but PDFs are not. While there are PDF editors available, they don't usually work as well as editing the raw file. Excel files require a specific program to read and edit them, so it can be hard to share such documents with people who don't have the needed software. However, the PDF format is much more ubiquitous, so as long as there's a PDF viewer installed on the computer, you can view the file without the need for a spreadsheet viewer/editor. If you're working with Excel documents, there's a good chance you already have Excel on your computer. 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
