I hope to know how to manage difficult situations. It is inevitable that you have to give give Rigid feedback at some point, whether it's a small conversation or something career. I know situations like these are difficult for all the subjects involved, but at some point you have to go up for the good of the team, the project, your colleague, yourself and the business. Example of a good answer "Once I was peer review of an article I thought he didn't hit the sign for the subject and the audience we were going later. The person who wrote was senior for me, so I was worried about going to They with this feedback, but I listed all my reasons why this article didn't work for our goals. During our conversation, they were able to understand the feedback and expressed how much they appreciated they by saying to them. We talked through the My ideas and were able to rework the piece in something we were both very proud of ". What is the project you are proud of completion? I want to hear about a project that was challenging or complex - something that, when he is finished, felt proud of yourself for completion. Maybe you learned to work well with others or invented a process to make the completion of the project go a little more smooth, or maybe it's something that means a lot for you. There is really no wrong answer here, but I want to hear about something that has been significant for you. Example of a good answer "Last year in my class, I had a group project that brought us some time to choose a topic and start. It was hard, but once we sat down, aligned on the subject , and assigned roles, we came together, and I was so proud of what we did. We put in a lot of work and ended up with a project. The first thing I would say here is that it's nice to show your personality in an interview, but don't obscure. Once I interviewed someone who was very overharrow and he told me some really strange and personal stories - not really good appearance during an interview. Secondly, try to avoid long and drawn answers. Give me enough information to understand your role in a project and how you worked with teammates, but don't tell me every single detail of the class. If my question is not clear or you're not sure what I'm looking for, let me know and try to ask for a different way. Any suggestion for someone who has been fired or has has In their curriculum? In general, see a gap in a curriculum does not concern us. Life happens, and I am more interested in the experience you have, not that you may have interrupted in the middle. However, I would simply suggest being honest on any gap if your interviewer asks. Are he sending a thanksgiving note after the expected or valuable interview? Personally you don't expect a note to thank after an interview and I would never have counted the lack of a note against anyone. But it always makes me smile when I thank you, especially if it is customized to our conversation. Any advice to successfully interview on zoom? Zoom interviews are our current reality and we all have to adapt. The most important thing to remember is that we are all in the same situation - most of all are now keeping their meetings on zoom, and interviews are not different for me as an interviewer. We have all pets and children and roommates or partners that could end up in the background of a zoom meeting, and that's fine! We all understand it. It is guaranteed that one of my two cats will walk through my screen or ends up in the background of a meeting at least once a day, and the interviews are not exempt from these visits. On a more practical note, I would suggest to test your zoom before your interview. This includes make sure you know how to access and use the camera, test your audio and make sure you have headphones at your fingertips. If you happen to have a shaky or unstable internet connection on your interview's day, don't worry - we've been all before. In some cases where someone has a shaky connection, I often suggest that we will both turn off the cameras and simply speak, because it generally helps keep audio from freezing.
