At the age of 16, he joined Spelman College, where he joined several clubs, including the glee club, and was voted "Most distinguished student". She graduated in economics and continued to attend Columbia University, where she earned two masters in education. He taught elementary school for eight years before returning to Spelman and becoming an associate professor. During that time he wrote three books about his life and his famous brother. She retired in 2014. Farris was married to Isaac Newton Farris Sr. until his death and had two sons, Isaac Newton Farris Jr. and Angela Christine Farris Watkins. Information about A.D.
